MINUTES OF THE 114th ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF THE PAPATOETOE CRICKET CLUB

Held on the 5th July 2020 at 4pm at the Kolmar Sports Centre

President Nigel Hurst officially opened the meeting at 4pm.

2. Obituaries

Nigel mentioned the passing of honorary Life Member, Jerry Green. Nigel gave a short summary of Jerry's playing days and some great memories they had. Also, mentioned that there is a write-up of Jerry in the Annual Booklet.

3. Confirmation of Minutes from 113th Annual General Meeting

 a) Matters arising from 113th Annual General Meeting Minutes: L Shaw to be added to Vice Presidents, Life Members P Boyd, N Ronaldson to be taken out.
 Moved that the minutes be accepted as a fair and accurate record, Neil Ronaldson; Seconded Peter Boyd.

Carried.

4. Correspondence:

a. **PCC** (Garry): Nigel Hurst asked Garry Wood for any correspondence to the Club. Garry Wood confirmed that only day-to-day emails are received.

b. ACA Report: Nigel called James Kemp to the front to provide ACA report.

- James Kemp gave a quick summary of the playing season including Aces and Hearts winning their respective titles and contracted Black Caps and White Ferns players. Also confirmed that the international and domestic playing schedules are not yet available and is likely to come out in August with the delay due to Covid-19.

- Also provided a quick summary of the Batfirst initiative that was introduced to low-decile schools.

- Mentioned the increased numbers in umpires and their workload with over 1600 standing days.

- The season saw a steady growth across all grades.

- ACA have committed to \$870K package for all Clubs. Also mentioned that there is an opt-in and opt-out programme for the hardship fund for ball costs.

ACA are also providing Professional Development (PD) opportunities for Club Managers.
 ACA are also in a cross-code working group with winter codes. Winter codes will finish up at the end of sept with cricket starting in the last week of October and finishing last week of March.

James thanked the club for all their efforts at this time and asked the floor for questions.
Denis asked for feedback around financial struggles and wanted insight into how we compare to other clubs especially around success with grant funding.

James mentioned that all other clubs are in the same boat around grant funding and advised that all Clubs get grants in as soon as possible.

- Denis asked whether ACA have any additional support after Covid-19 and whether direct grants are available for clubs to help with the impact of Covid.

James mentioned that no additional funding is available but mentioned that some clubs have been able to access the ANZ community funding. Peter Boyd mentioned that we are able to get up to 10K.

- Kevin Henderson raised a question around current water issues and whether it would affect the upcoming season.

James mentioned that ACA is aware and have been talking to local contractors and confirmed that it is looking positive with low impact on the season at this stage. No further questions.

Nigel Hurst thanked James Kemp for his time to deliver ACA's report and thanked ACA for their ongoing support of the Club.

5. President's Report

 Nigel gave those present some time to read through the report. Moved Gary Troup; Seconded Denis Currie that the Presidents report was taken as read and accepted.

Carried.

6. Chairman of the Management Committee Report:

 Nigel gave those present some time to read through the report. Moved Peter Boyd, Seconded Garry Wood the Chairman's report was taken as read and accepted.

Carried.

7. Presentation and adoption of Annual Report and Draft Balance Sheet for 2019/20

a. Financial Report:

Nigel handed over to General Manager, Garry Wood.

- Garry mentioned that the Club has struggled financially over the past season. Mentioned that we have coached 4000-5000 kids at least once this season. Mentioned that schools coaching has been costly and that the Club is trying to cut back.
- ii. In regards to revenue, the Club lost a lot of support from gaming machine trusts e.g. Akarana funding went from 30K to 5K. The Club also didn't get the sponsorship that they had hoped for due to Covid-19. However, the deal is still on the table for next season. Also mentioned that the Club's revenue has been in fundraising and sponsorship but the Club hasn't been great at event management.
- iii. Delved into aspects of the Financial Report and pointed out that it is a draft at this stage as it is currently sitting with the auditor.
- iv. Mentioned that there are no cash reserves as the Club sold shares to keep finances afloat. Objective for next season is to put money aside for reserves as contingency.
- v. Credit/Expenses down.
- vi. Loan from Bhupinder Singh that needs to be paid back.
- vii. Donations and fundraising down. However, there was a significant push during Level 4 lockdown where past players/members pushed donations up.
- viii. Mentioned struggle with collecting member subscriptions but made mention of how outstanding Simon Poole was as Club Manager with collecting subs.
- ix. Three years ago the Club was using MYOB then moved to Xero to try and link invoicing with Crichq subscriptions.
- x. Budget going forward is currently underway and Garry Wood was welcome to questions around this and made a mention of a potential change in the committee,

and that the incoming chairman is on board with a process. Will endeavour to put a lid on spending.

- xi. Garry made mention of the impact of Covid19 and that it was positive in terms of wage subsidies and loans which has enabled the Club to stabilize cash flow during this period. Also mentioned that it helped the Club reflect on our business and that there is still quite a lot of work to do on that.
- xii. Garry mentioned that he will get the constitution done as soon as possible.

Garry to open the floor up for questions. Nigel thanked Garry Wood for his efforts.

Moved: Neil Ronaldson that the financial report be accepted; Seconded Gary Troup.

Carried.

8. Election of Officers for the 2020-21 Season

Neil Ronaldson moved that all listed nominations for committee for 2020/21 be accepted; Seconded by Peter Ambler.

Carried.

Nigel asked for any further Management Committee nominations from the floor: Steven Neilson was nominated. Moved Neil Ronaldson; Seconded Mike Jamieson. Logan Clark was nominated. Moved Peter Boyd, Seconded Neil Ronaldson.

Nigel Hurst left the stand for election of President with Garry Wood taking the chair. Garry Wood called for Nigel Hurst to be re-elected as President. Moved Gary Troup, Seconded Mike Jamieson.

Nigel Hurst resumed the Chair and called for Guy Ronaldson to be re-elected as Patron. Moved Josh Plummer; Seconded Gareth Shaw.

Carried.

9. General Business

- Dan Neilson asked about whether our honours boards are stored somewhere and if they will be put up again. Nigel Hurst confirmed that they are stored somewhere and Kolmar have confirmed that there is no allocated space to put them up, unfortunately. Mike Jamieson made mention of a potential electronic honours board and Nigel reiterated that the Club definitely does need to do something to display the history of our club. Perhaps starting with asking Kolmar for a small space to hang premier photos. Also, even the idea of having a movable piece for photos and honours boards. Nigel reaffirmed that the Club will definitely look into it.
- b. Denis Currie recognised Peter Boyd and Gary Troup who are standing down from the Committee and mentioned the 9 new nominees who are willing to go onto the committee.

Also asked James Kemp to take information from our AGM back to ACA. And made mention of Garry Wood's Financial Report summary and is feeling more positive about the club and thanked the committee for their efforts.

- c. Nigel asked everyone to refer to the back page around office bearers and made a special mention around the history with himself and Peter Boyd and acknowledged the many years Peter has put into the Club as Chairman. Nigel thanked Peter dearly and that the Club is indebted to him.
- d. Nigel also acknowledged Gary Troup and his great contribution over the years and asked the floor to give them a round of applause.
- e. Gary Troup endorsed what Nigel said and acknowledged Peter for what he has done over the years and how much he has shouldered a lot of the Club's struggles himself. Also made mention of how encouraging it is to see the number of people who have put their hand up for the Committee and that he will always be around to support the Club. Also acknowledged David, Denis and Simon Poole for all their efforts, and reiterated that their hearts are in the Club and would like to see it succeed. Mentioned the importance of the Club's memorabilia and endorsed the idea of a moving piece. Gary also made mention of how the Club is conscious of the importance of raising funds which has been left to Garry Wood and Regina Lilii to do it all which is hard with it being a 12-month role as opposed to seasonal like the 'old times'. General Manager's Report

The 2020-21 season proved to be a season of dealing with significant disruption. With Covid-19 impacting on the end of the previous season, no-one really knew what the incoming seasion held.

Due to the lockdowns in March and April the senior and junior prizegivings were held in conjunction with the AGM in late July. This proved to be a really good idea as it then meant the AGM was really well attended.

At the AGM a completely new committee was welcomed in. They were: Lindsay Rewcastle, Neil Ronaldson, Lance Shaw, Mike Jamieson, Stephen Nelson, Balraj Gill and Logan Clark. This was really heartening to see so much fresh energy and thinking prepared to help with the running of the Club. Lindsay Rewcastle was appointed as the new Chairman to follow Peter Boyd.

My thanks to Peter who toiled away for quite a few years largely to get the Club through some tough times, along with the advice and support of Gary Troup. Both were solid rocks on which the staff based decisions and actions for a long time, however it is really encouraging to see a lot of new faces at Committee meetings.

A special mention of Nigel Hurst who remains on as President and supports the Club with his sage advice and unmistakeable presence as an MC at so many of the Club's functions.

The run into the 2020 season was challenging to say the least. With the initial impact of covid 19 the off and pre season had a very different feel to nomal. The amount of legistlation and rules that impacted on the start of winter trainings added so much confusion and frustration to the start up, but such was the impact of the virus.

One very important result of covid was three less junior teams registering than the previous season, and one less men's grade side. Whether this was disrectly due to covid is debateable, but it meant the Club failed to reach the threshold for principle club status for last season year and will be put on notice by Auckland Cricket. This has implications for the ACA grant the Club gets and could see us lose about \$10k in external funding, however with enough time to address the situation I am confident the Club will do better in the recruitment of new players, especially in the junior section.

Finding enough income is always an issue as the Club walks a financial tightrope. Getting sponsorship was identified as a must do and we thought we had signed off a very good deal for the three year sponsorship with local builders, Designer Homes. However after just one payment covid struck again as the sponsors found themselves in a tricky financial postion and have not contributed to our income again, to this point. This had a significant inmpact on the Club's projected cashflow towards the end of the financial year as we didn't get some of the grants we applied for and were left with expenses to settle such as prizegiving awards out of existing funds.

Every year income is very low from around February through to when subs start coming in around August. Last year was no exception. The support in donations and match ball sponsorship was well appreciated as old Boys again supported the Club as they always have.

The Club gereally did well with the grants that were applied for with a slight rise in income up from the previous year. However it would be unwise to to think we will continue to get close to that level from that source every year. With that in mind we really do need to look ar sponsorship and fundraising with an intent to significantly improve on these two segments of our revenue streams. In late October the Club organised a hugely successful fundraising luncheon with ex Black Cap captain and Papatoetoe player, John Wright, as the guest speaker. It is this sort of club based initiative that needs to be bedded in as part of our fundraising DNA. Huge pludits to Gary Troup who worked so hard to mke a success with this function by driving the efforts in finding sponsors and auction donations and in making sure all of the component parts were aligned and in place. Many others helped in large and small ways, and we appreciated support from sponsors that included Barfoot and Thompson, Chillex, Cooper Tyres in Manukau.

Along with the introduction of the new sponsor, the Club went through a complete makeover of the playing uniforms. While it will take another season to see all the changes across all teams, it is intended the new playing uniforms add some pride to playing for the Club, both on and off the field.

In addition the Club employed well known local cricketer, Barrington Rowland in the role as Head Coach. Barringon had a very strong playing record in Indai during his formative years, with over 5000 runs scored at domestic level in local competitions. Barrington is passionate about coaching aspiring players and has made an immediate impression of all sections of the Club where he has been working.

A new initiative was the instigation of the ASPIRE

Academy. Intake one saw eight young club members beteeen the age of twelve and fifteen invited to attend regular sessions under the tutelege of Head Coach, Barrington Rowland. These boys train 2-3 hours a wek with Barrington with a view to growing very good young cricketers as part of the Club's aim of being a contender at the higher grades in the near future. As part of the 2020 sessions the Club used Kyle Jamieson, Lochie Freguson and Colin Munro as guest presenters.

So I was very proud of how our young'ns and the squad were able to adapt, take the challenge head-on and make the most of their opportunities playing in the premier grade.

Strengths & Highlights:

She was awarded the Premier Women's MVP and sits 7th in the overall Auckland Cricket Women's MVP ladder. Her quick progress and individual success was on the back of a lot of hard work with extra net sessions, already demonstrating her top-class work ethic, attitude, and willingness to learn. I look forward to her debuting on the domestic stage in the near future!

- Caitlin Hakeagatoa showed consistent performances with the ball as a genuine outswing bowler. Despite not taking regular wickets herself, Caitlin created a lot of dot-ball pressure that contributed to wickets at the other end. This consistency was recognised by Auckland selectors at the ACA Districts tournament where she represented Manukau and earned a well-deserved spot in the Auckland U19 Women's team who ended up champions at the national tournament.
- Barrington Rowland and Maia Lewis both contributed in the coaching department throughout the season. Barrington was involved more in the pre-season build-up and Maia in the pre-Xmas competition. It was fantastic to have both coaches involved and hopefully, we will have their knowledge and expertise on a more consistent basis in the 2021/22 season.
- Jaimie Veale's first season with Papatoetoe has been a standout one after taking several seasons off since playing for Central-West. Joined halfway through the season playing eight matches and racking up 11 wickets taking three 3-fers along the way with best figures of 4/12 against Howick Pakuranga.

Weaknesses & Improvements:

- Batting. Our team averaged 80 in the T20 competition and 121 in the One Day competition with team scores ranging from 36 to 235. This will be a huge focus for us next season by strengthening our basic batting fundamentals and reiterating the art of balancing discipline, strike-rotation, and power-hitting! This will hopefully build more depth in our batting order and improve our ability to bat for longer periods.
- Mindset. We need to keep improving in this area in the women's space by reiterating the • importance of positive self-talk, body language, mindset, and self-belief. This in turn will help improve our overall team culture too!

Fitness and fielding. Improving our overall fitness levels will ensure we stay focused, active •

- and energised throughout our fielding innings so that we give ourselves the best chance of taking crucial opportunities. More fielding drills off the bat and outdoors will also help improve our skills, anticipation and awareness.
- Tactics and situational awareness. Our bowling attack was definitely our team's strength but as a bowling unit at times, we lacked clarity around our plans and the ability to execute them (e.g. bowling a simple plan to get hit on the off-side to force batsman to risk playing across the line). Same goes with our batting plans and situational awareness (e.g. simple plan to spin, getting out at crucial times etc.)



which can be improved through more open-wicket scenarios.

• Consistent wicket-keeper. Unfortunately, we were without experienced wicket-keeper Lia Bourne so this role was shared around the team with Davinya Lulia being the stand-out in Lia's absence as she had good hands and a great attitude. Next season, we will need to work on continuing to develop Davinya (if she is keen) as a future wicket-keeper/batter in our Premier side.

Thanks Garry, Barrington, and Maia for all the invaluable coaching you provided throughout the season, and to the Club for its continual support and to all the girls (and parents) for being so patient and understanding in what was a very challenging season for the Premier Women.

We look forward to continuing to develop and improve into the 2021/22 season!
